

Pin/Barrette BNL-124a

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For this barrette or pin you will need:

About **4** yards of 3-ply metallic embroidery thread, and **350** seed beads size 10



Symbols & Abbreviations

- R** ring;
- FR** floating ring;
- CH** chain;
- 1, 2, 3** number of double knots;
 - very small picot;
- ⊕ 'SWIRL' join (joining a few rings at once);
- LJ** lock join (shuttle join);
- close a ring or shape a chain;
- RW** reverse work;
- SS** switch shuttles;
- ⊙ **3 'up'** beads on knotting thread make a 'POINTED' picot;
- ⊙ **3 'up'** beads on knotting thread & **1 'down'** bead on the core thread make a 'DIAMOND' picot;
- ⊙⊙⊙ **4 'up'** beads on knotting thread & **4 'down'** beads on core thread make a 'BLOCK' of 8 beads.
















































'up' beads (beads on knotting thread) *come either from the ball, or from the left hand shuttle, or from the loop on your left hand;*

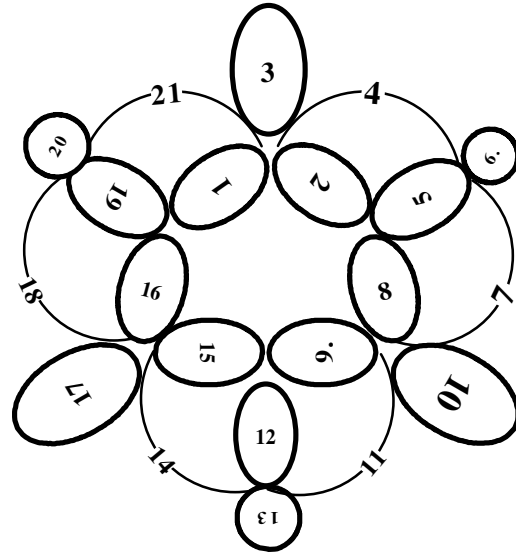
'down' beads (beads on the core thread) *are ALWAYS-ALWAYS from the shuttle in your right hand.*

Example: **11/8** next to a ring notation means: **11** beads should be placed on the left hand loop **before** starting the ring, these are **'up'** beads; **8** beads you will push from the right hand shuttle as needed, these are **'down'** beads.

Pattern for the Pin:

Take 3½ - 4 yards of thread and string **200-210** beads on one tail for **sh. A**, and **135-140** beads on the second tail for **sh. B**; load 1½ - 2 yards of thread with **200-210** beads on **sh. A** and the rest of the thread with **135-140** beads on **sh. B**. Follow the pattern.

- 12) R: 2  2 - 2  2.SS 8/8
- 13) FR: 2  2.SS 3/0
- 14) CH: 2  1  1  2.RW 11/9
- 15) R: 2  2 \oplus (to R12 and R9) 2  2. 8/8
- 16) R: 2  2 - 2  2.SS 8/8
- 17) FR: 2  2  2  2.SS 11/8
- 18) CH: 2  1  1  2.RW 11/9
- 19) R: 2  2 \oplus (to R16 and R1) 2  2.SS 8/8
- 20) FR: 2  2.SS 3/0
- 21) CH: 2  1  1  2.LJ at the base of R1. 11/9



Tie the tails and hide them inside blocks of beads.
